Principal's Message

Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you to all students who are meeting our expectation of being safe at school by wearing broad brimmed school hats whilst playing in the sun. If parents can, sunscreen could also be applied before your children leave home to offer them further protection. Also, it is important that students bring a drink bottle to school. Having a drink bottle in the classroom reduces lost learning time by allowing students to drink water in the classroom while they are learning and not to have to go outside to the bubblers for a drink.

<u>Intensive Swimming</u> begins next week at Alstonville Pool and will continue for 5 days. This year the program will run differently than it has in the past due to COVID restrictions on the number of students that can be at the facility at any one time.

- Kindergarten, Year 1, Year 2 and some Year 3 students will attend the first session leaving school at 10.45am and returning at 12.00pm
- The remaining Year 3 Year 6 students will attend a second session leaving school at 11.45am and returning at 1.00pm. This is a fantastic, long running program funded by the Department of Education.
- To save time and reduce the chance of lost belongings, it is asked that students arrive
 at school with their swimmers on underneath their uniform. Students will then change
 out of their swimmers when back at school.

Our swimming program is an in school event, therefore students and teachers only will be attending. It would be appreciated if you could send your child/ren with two towels. One for the pool and one to sit on in the bus on the return trip

<u>2021 Major Excursion</u> – Plans are underway for this excursion. Next year it is scheduled to be a visit to Canberra and the snow. Looking back over our records, the last time Rous PS went to the snow it cost approximately \$800 per student. I have attached an expression of interest to this week's newsletter seeking input from you as to the viability of this excursion due to the cost. I would appreciate it if you fill it out and return it to school by next **Friday, 4 December**.

<u>Social Enterprise</u> – continued this week with Year 6 students preparing for the market day to be held at Alstonville High School on Wednesday, 9 December. Many of the groups already have some products available to sell. Regardless of the financial outcome of each group, this has been a wonderful experience for our students in collaboration, especially remotely, and building entrepreneurial skills.

<u>Year 7 Orientation at Alstonville HS</u> – Following Social Enterprise yesterday, our Year 6 students experienced a taster of high school with an orientation session. Students brought home a bag with information for parents. Thanks to Alstonville HS for this event and for the bus transport back to Rous.

<u>2021 Captain Speeches</u> – Year 5 students have begun to prepare their speeches and will deliver them to the whole school at a special assembly on Monday of Week 9. Students will then return to their classes to vote. 2021 School Captains will be announced at the K-6 end of year awards assembly on Thursday of Week 9.
