Year 6 Upcoming events

With the ease of restrictions on Level 3 schools as of Monday, 8 November. We can now move forward on our Year 6 celebration day and farewell.

End of year celebration will be held at Ballina Waterslides on Wednesday, 8 December.

Farewell assembly will be held on Monday, 13 December at school at 2.00pm. This was originally going to be combined with the presentation night- however we are now able to have this event on site. Year 6 parents will be on the only ones allowed on site to attend this event.

We have had a few students lately experiencing cold symptoms.

These are the Education Department guidelines for students experiencing symptoms:

All students are expected to be at school unless they are unwell. Do not attend school if unwell, even with mild symptoms. Get tested for COVID-19 and follow NSW Health directions.

If you have any COVID-19 symptoms you will be sent home and must not return to school unless you have either:

- isolated for 10 days, when no medical certificate is available
- a negative COVID-19 test result and are symptom free.

In circumstances where a student has other medical reasons for recurrent symptoms, a letter from your GP is sufficient to negate the requirement for a negative test.

Self-isolation periods and testing requirements differ for close contacts based on their exposure and vaccination status. If you are identified as a close contact, an authorised contact tracer from NSW Health or from the department's Health and Safety Directorate will contact you and let you what you need to do. 
Kindergarten 2022
