2024 Year 5 Opportunity Class Placement

Is opportunity class placement the right fit for my child?

What does high potential and intellectually gifted mean?

High potential students are those whose potential **exceeds** that of students of the same age.

Gifted students are those whose potential significantly exceeds that of students of the same age.

This could be in one or more areas, such as:

- intellectual
- creative
- physicalsocial-emotional

Tips for identifying if your child has high academic potential

High potential and gifted students often have some, or all, of the following characteristics, they:

- enjoy learning
- have intense curiosity
- display a good memory
- ask complex questions
- enjoy learning new and often complex ideas or skills
- require fewer repetitions when learning new things
- are creative
- become intensely focused in their area of interest or passion

Please keep in mind that these traits are only one way to identify high potential students. Some high potential and intellectually gifted students may not act like this, for example, due to lack of opportunity, disability or disadvantage.

Ask your child's teacher if you want advice about whether your child might benefit from attending an opportunity class.

More information is available in the department's High Potential and Gifted Education Policy.



Opportunity classes are for primary school students who have high academic potential or who are intellectually gifted.

They provide an environment where students can learn and make friends with classmates of similar ability. This can benefit a student's academic progress and also their wellbeing.

Opportunity classes are offered in Years 5 and 6, with parents/carers applying in Year 4.

Students who are successfully placed will usually have to leave their current school to enrol in a school with an opportunity class for Years 5 and 6. Opportunity classes are just one of the ways that we cater for our high potential and gifted students.

Testing and assessment

Applications for opportunity class placement are considered on the results of the Opportunity Class Placement Test. Students who wish to be considered for placement are required to sit the Opportunity Class Placement Test on Thursday 27 July 2023.





Differences in the K-2 and 3-6 syllabus content

Phonological awareness, print conventions and phonic knowledge are taught and most often consolidated in the early years of primary school (K-2). They are constrained skills. The aim of instruction is to achieve 'mastery' of these skills before Year 3. That is why you do not see them referenced as content to be taught in 3-6.

Constrained skills are necessary, though not sufficient, for full literacy. They are best taught and assessed systematically as part of comprehensive language and literacy program.

The figures below show the organisation of English K-2 and 3-6 syllabus content.





Phonological awareness

Phonological awareness focuses on the sounds withing spoken words such as syllables and rhymes.

Early Stage 1 (Kindergarten)

You can help at home by:

- Clapping or tapping the syllables they can hear in words when reading together. For example, dog (sone syllable – one clap), zeb/ra (2 syllables – two claps) and el/e/phant (3 syllables – 3 claps)
- Playing rhyming games such as starting with a base word and taking turns to say a new rhyming word. For example, the base would of hat, can be rhymed with bat, sat, mat, flat and chat. Made up (or nonsense) words can also be used such as blat, lat and zat.
- Reading or listening to nursery rhymes, songs and poetry.

What does this mean for students in Years 3-6?

When a student is having difficulty with reading comprehension, it is important to investigate if there are phonological awareness and/or phonic knowledge concerns. Where concerns are identified, intervention may be needed to strengthen these word recognition skills to the point of automaticity.
